ScotPHO – the Scottish Public Health Observatory - are currently looking at the feasibility of including mental health indicators in their 2016 Community Health profiles. The proposed indicators are as follows:

Overall mean mental wellbeing score	Mean mental wellbeing score
Pro-social behaviour mean score	Mean life satisfaction score
Emotional symptoms mean score	Common mental health problems (% $\geq 4$ on GHQ12)
Peer problems (=emotional problems) score	Alcohol dependency (% $\geq 2$ on CAGE , above threshold on AUDIT)
Conduct problems score	
Hyperactivity score
